Wren Warne-Jacobsen - 2022 U.S. Figure Skating Senior Ladies National Championships Qualifier. One of 18 skaters in the United States to qualify. Wren will compete in Nashville, Tennessee January 3-9, 2022. She is just the 3rd Minnesota senior ladies competitor to qualify for U.S. Nationals since 2010. She will compete alongside USA Olympians Karen Chen, Bradie Tennell and Mariah Bell.

Wren is a dedicated and accomplished student. She currently ranks 3rd in her class and has a 3.98 gpa as a high school senior at Minnesota Virtual Academy, an online school that allows her the flexibility of doing school work no matter where she is training or competing. She is a member of the MNVA President's Honor Roll and a member of the MNVA chapter of the National Honor Society. Wren has been accepted to the University of Minnesota where she plans to study Political Science, Government and Law.

Wren trains more than 20 hours per week. Expenses for training at this elite level are multiple, including; ice time, coaching, off-ice training, skates and blades, costumes, sports psychology, competitions and travel. Annual costs of skating have exceeded \$65,000 a year. Her goal is to get to the 2026 Olympics hosted by Italy.

What is the New England Amateur Skating Foundation?

The NEASF is a non-profit organization whose primary mission is to help amateur competitive skaters financially by defraying some of their ever-increasing training expenses. The Foundation is a tax-exempt organization under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Donations are received from both individuals and corporations. The monies received are then distributed to skaters to assist with training, ice fees, equipment, competition or travel expenses. The NEASF Allocations Committee reviews its information about a skater and allocates funds accordingly. Information reviewed includes comments and recommendations of clubs, professionals, donors, as well as the experience and competitive level of the skater.

To receive support all skaters must submit a bill signed by the skater, parent and head coach. Payment is made directly to the vendor or service provider. **Ninety eight percent of your donation goes to the skater.** The NEASF charges no fees to the skater, but there is a 2% allocation for administrative and compliance expenses.
